Northern Vermont Covered Bridge Tour



Vermont is known for its abundance of covered bridges. Some of our sites have these charming crossings nearby and they are such a feature of rivers across the state. Next time you are exploring Northern VT, by paddle or car, stop by one of these sites!

1 Cambridge: Poland Covered Bridge

The Poland Covered Bridge features a paddling access site located just across the river from the Lamoille Valley Rail Trail. With so many recreation options available from this site, there will surely be something for everyone. Walk or drive over the historic covered bridge, paddle down the Lamoille, or walk or ride by on your bike.

2 Columbia: Columbia Covered Bridge

Columbia Covered Bridge, which is about 5 miles from Colebrook, New Hampshire along the Connecticut River, is another of our paddling access sites. Enjoy a paddle along the river to view the bridge. If you're looking to stay in the area overnight, this site is not too far from our Nulhegan Hut and Trails, or you could choose to tent camp right on the river's edge at one of the many nearby paddlers' campsites.

3 Lyndon: Sanborn Covered Bridge

Sanborn Covered Bridge in Lyndon is soon to be one of our protected access sites! We are working with the town of Lyndon to protect access and habitat along the section of river that this covered bridge is on. Once fully restored, the bridge will be a place to bring the community together and increase access to natural areas.
